9th World Meeting of Families: - In 2018, the 9th World meeting of Families is expected to attract thousands of Catholic families from around the globe to Ireland. It is hoped that this very special pastoral initiative will present all of us in the Church with the opportunity, and the challenge, to renew, support and strengthen Irish families in their commitment to their faith. Hosting a global event of this size requires a huge amount of planning and financial outlay on behalf of the host country. Accordingly, there will be three national church collections, the first of which will take place this weekend and will replace the Share Collection. The remaining collections will take place in 2017 and 2018. The World Meeting of Families is held every three years and is the largest universal gathering of Catholic families and brings together families from all over the world in faith and celebration.
