Readings for Today – Sun: 16<sup>th</sup> July: The First Reading: From the prophet Isaiah, brings an image of God's fruitful activity in the heart of the believer. The Second Reading: From St. Paul, reveals his vision of a liberated humanity longing for the glory to be found through those bearing the fruits of God's Spirit. The Gospel of Matthew: Tells the parable of the sower whose labours meets varying degrees of success, depending on the quality of the soil where the seed is scattered.

Special Collection for East Africa: There are severe food

shortages in South Sudan, Somalia, Kenya and Ethiopia brought about by drought and conflict. Over half the population of Somalia (6.2 million people) is experiencing food shortages and malnutrition. There have also been major outbreaks of cholera across the country. South Sudan is on the brink of famine, with drought and conflict affecting millions. Millions of people in south-eastern Ethiopia and northern Kenya are in urgent need of humanitarian assistance. On behalf of Irish Catholics, Trócaire is doing all it possibly can - currently helping over 150,000 people across the region with emergency food, water and sanitation. The need is enormous and the Bishops' Conference is responding by launching an emergency Church Appeal throughout Ireland to take place on <u>Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> and Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2017.</u> In the Archdiocese of <u>Dublin</u> it will replace the Share Collection.
