# Christian Unity Service, St. Patrick's Church ~ Monday, 23<sup>rd</sup> January 8pm.

Our parish has the honour of hosting the Annual Service of Prayer for Unity among Christians. This year is very significant as the commemoration of the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Protestant Reformation is being marked. It was the desire of Pope John Paul II for the year 2000 both Catholics and Lutherans would sign an accord, in a humble manner, acknowledging the mutual sins of the past in regard to the causes of the Reformation. The theological accord of common understanding in regard to Justification – the major theological issue at the time, was signed in an agreed statement. This was a wonderful moment of divine grace for the two Churches. Towards the end of 2016 Pope Francis went to Lund in Sweden for the international commemoration of the Protestant Reformation. Both Papal initiatives are of profound historical and current significance.

This year the Lutheran Pastor Stephan Arras, St. Finian's Lutheran Church, Adelaide Road will preach the sermon at the Service in St. Patrick's Church, Esker. Perhaps this is the first time a Lutheran pastor has preached in a Catholic Church in Lucan. Please make a special effort to attend. *Hospitality will be offered after the service*.
