Pádraíc Carney: Pádraic Carney, a Dublin primary school principal who died in a traffic collision while cycling to work on Tuesday was previously principal at Scoil Áine Naofa. Mr Carney, (53), was the principal of St Louis' Senior Primary School in Rathmines. He was involved in a collision with a car at a junction on Butterfield Park in Rathfarnham, cycling from his home to work at 8.10am on Tuesday. He was taken to Tallaght Hospital where he was pronounced dead. Padraic's death is a terrible tragedy for his family and friends, and the whole school community. The school community at Scoil Áine Naofa and the parish share in their grief and loss. May he rest in peace.
