Liturgies for Children - Christmas Eve/Day - Health and Safety: There will be THREE Liturgies for children

- 1. Children's Christmas Eve Mass at 5pm.
- 2. Away in a Manger A Nativity Service at 6.30pm: Families with young children are invited to join us for a Parish Crib Service at 6.30pm. Our Service will tell the story of Jesus' birth and sing Christmas Carols. This is not a full Mass with holy communion and may be more suitable for some families. It is a reflection on and celebration of the story of the first Christmas.

The Mass on Christmas Eve caused serious concern to parents last year due to very dangerous levels of overcrowding, added to by the fact that several buggies blocked all the aisles. Since then we have spent a considerable amount of money investing in fire safety. However, this is insufficient without proper supervision.

This year when the church is FULL (with free access in the aisles) that will mean the church IS ACTUALLY FULL. Parishioners will be advised that there will be a 6.30pm Liturgy to follow and a 10.30am Mass for children again on Christmas Day.
