Sunday, 18th Feb – First Sunday of Lent: We have begun this season during which we are called to reach forward to the goodness and justice of God. Let us ask the Lord to bless all our efforts, we begin this Lenten Sunday Mass.

Readings - Sun. 18th Feb: The First Reading - The word 'covenant',

the biblical term for the warm relationship between God and his people, occurs five times in this short reading, reminding us that this season of Lent is all about the renewal of that relationship. The Second Reading — We are reminded of the reality of our baptism at the beginning of Lent. At the close of Lent, we will renew our baptismal promises at the Easter Vigil. The Gospel - In just a few lines, we see that there is no contradiction between the drama of temptation and the joyful proclamation of the Good News. This was the pattern of Jesus' life, and we need not fear the tension between our brokenness and the life we've been called to live.
