Readings - Sun. 7th Oct: The First Reading (Genesis: 2:18-24): The

high point of the story of creation is the creation of man and woman. Here we see



how the story suggests to us God's concern for man and woman. We encounter a God who is interested in the happiness of his created beings. We see here too that men and women complement each other. The masculine and feminine allow for a distinction and a diversity which enables

unity and wholeness when the two come together. *The Second Reading (Hebrews: 2:9-11):* In this reflection on priesthood, found in the Letter to the Hebrews, we see that Jesus has become one like us. Jesus has come into our world to raise us up with a new and unrealised dignity. Jesus has overcome death itself. Through baptism, we are brothers and sisters of the Risen Lord. *The Gospel (Mark 10: 2-16):* This section of Mark's Gospel reminds us of the demands of following Christ. Discipleship costs. Once a commitment is taken on, it remains. The teaching on marriage is a real challenge. The other part of the gospel is the invitation to remain childlike. We must grow beyond our childish ways but we should always remain childlike. To be childlike is to have a sense of wonder and awe. To be childlike is to be able to recognise the transcendent, to be able to encounter God.
