Readings - Sun. 3rd Nov: The First Reading - God is all-powerful,

yet as a judge he is gentle. He overlooks sins, not because he regards sin as being of little account, but so that the sinner may repent. There is no contradiction between God's gentle mercy and his wish to correct and admonish the sinner. *The Second Reading:* Devoutly religious people have always run the risk of – to use St. Paul's words – 'getting too excited too soon.' The desire to see God and his kingdom can lead us to an impatient excitability. St. Paul cautions against this, asking us to focus on our discipleship rather than on God's timetable. *The Gospel:* The word 'today' is of immense importance in Luke's Gospel. At the birth of Jesus, the Shepherds hear that a Saviour is born *today*. As Jesus dies, he promises the repentant thief that he will enter paradise *today*. It is *today* that salvation comes to the house of Zacchaeus. The Lord is at work in our lives and in our world *today*.
