Readings - Sun. 12th Jan: The First Reading - 'Here is my servant.'

These opening words from the first reading are reflected in the words of the Gospel, when Jesus emerges from the waters of baptism. 'This is my Son.' And just as in the reading from Isaiah, where God describes the servant as 'the One in whom my soul delights,' in the Gospel the Father declares that Jesus, his Son, is 'the Beloved,' on whom his favour rests. *The Second Reading:* 'God has no favourites.' All those who are in Jesus, the One on whom God's favour rests, find full favour with God the Father. *The Gospel:* John the Baptist is, quite frankly, mortified. Jesus, the sinless one, is coming to him, seeking the baptism of repentance, while it is he who needs to be cleansed by Jesus. But God's righteous plan is being fulfilled as Jesus enters the company of sinners, taking their side, taking on their sins.
