It was reflection on God's mercy towards himself that motivated Paul to keep proclaiming the gospel of mercy to others. *The Gospel:* This long Gospel reading is a gradual getting-to-know-you, in which an outcast, jaded, cynical woman comes to recognize Christ as her personal Saviour and the Saviour of the world.
